CURRICULUM UPDATE:

Dr. Parvey mentioned that second grade teachers participated in common core training for math and fifth grade teachers participated in common core training for reading. Dr. Parvey also addressed the board, staff members and residents present and thanked them for welcoming her to the West Islip school community and for the experiences she has gained while being on staff.

Mrs. Burns spoke common core standards on the secondary level. She also discussed the new evaluative tool that will be put into place for teachers and administrators. Mrs. Burns also mentioned the upcoming high school's "P.S. I Love You Day" regarding bullying and suicide awareness and encouraged all to become involved. Mrs. Burns also congratulated Dr. Parvey and thanked her for their working relationship and wished her success and happiness in her new position.

The following course and curriculum development proposals were reviewed by the Secondary Curriculum Council at its November 28, 2011 meeting. They are recommended for development or approval as described below. If these projects meet with your approval, kindly place them on the agenda for the February 9, 2012 Education Committee and Board of Education meetings for approval.

The proposed projects can be categorized as follows:

- New Course Proposal
 - *Calculus* is a full-year course designed to prepare students for college-level math. It will broaden our offerings in the Mathematics Departments for students who have completed the three-credit sequence in math plus Pre-Calculus, wish to take a fourth year of math, but are not ready for a college level calculus course. Implementation will not require additional staffing, but will incur a cost of approximately \$3300 for textbooks.

- Course Name Changes
 - To more accurately convey the content of courses, and based on feedback from counselors and students, there is a need to revise the titles of some of the courses in the Business Department. Except for minor revisions to some of the topics addressed, the curriculum remains the same.
 - *Information Processing* → *Microsoft Office 2010*
 - *Business Law* → *Business and Personal Law*
 - *Web Wizards* → *Web Design*

- Completed Curriculum Development Project
 - *Spanish 1A* (The *Spanish 1B* curriculum is a work in progress.) A copy of the completed project is available for your review.

ADDENDUM

WHEREAS, West Islip Union Free School District (the "District") and School Construction Consultants, Inc., (hereinafter also referred to as the "Construction Manager" or the "Consultant") have entered into an Agreement, dated _____, pursuant to which the Construction Manager has provided professional services in connection with the capital improvement of various District properties and educational facilities, (the "2008 Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the District and the Consultant have entered into an Addendum to the Agreement, dated _____, pursuant to which the Consultant Manager has provided additional professional services in connection with the capital improvement of various District properties and educational facilities, (the "2011 Addendum"); and

WHEREAS, the District wishes to retain the Consultant to provide comprehensive construction management services in connection with additional projects which were not part of the scope of work set forth in the 2008 Agreement and which were not part of the scope of work set forth in the 2011 Addendum (the "Additional Projects"); and

WHEREAS, the District and the Construction Manager and the Consultant wish to memorialize an Agreement pursuant to which the Construction Manager will provide comprehensive construction management services in connection with the Additional Projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. The District and the Construction Manager have agreed that the Construction Manager will provide comprehensive construction management services in connection with the following Additional Projects and that such services shall be performed in accordance with the terms of the 2008 Agreement.

<u>PROJECT DESCRIPTIONS</u>	<u>COST OF THE WORK ESTIMATES</u>
1. pool locker room demolition and reconstruction (boys and girls)	\$625,000 for both
2. bathrooms renovated (2, 4 or 6 depending on bid prices)	\$35,000 each
3. athletic field storage buildings/sheds (1-3 depending on bid prices)	\$180,000 for three
4. security camera system installation	\$75,000 - \$200,000
5. general construction management of related change orders or additional projects.	

2. The Parties agree the Consultant shall provide services to the District in connection with the above referenced Additional Projects for the period January 15, 2012 through November 15, 2012 as follows:

- Principal: part-time – January 15, 2012 through June 15, 2012
- Principal: part-time – June 15, 2012 through October 15, 2012
- Principal: part-time – October 15, 2012 through November 15, 2012
- Project Executive : part-time – January 15, 2012 through June 15, 2012
- Project Executive: part-time – June 15, 2012 through October 15, 2012
- Project Executive: part-time – October 15, 2012 through November 15, 2012
- Project Manager: full-time – June 15, 2012 through October 15, 2012
- Project Manager: full-time – October 15, 2012 through November 15, 2012

Pre-Construction Phase shall be January 15, 2012 to June 15, 2012.

Construction Phase shall be June 15, 2012 to October 15, 2012.

Post-Construction Phase shall be October 15, 2012 to November 15, 2012.

3. For the services as set forth above, the Construction Manager shall be compensated seventy-one thousand five hundred and xx/100 (\$71,500.00) dollars, which sum shall be paid in equal monthly installments of seven thousand one hundred fifty and xx/100 (\$7,150.00) dollars and reflected in detailed monthly invoices which the Construction Manager shall submit to the District.

4. The fee set forth in paragraph 3 above is all inclusive for Construction Manager's services associated with the work described in paragraph 1 above. There shall be no other fee or reimbursable expense for the Construction Manager.

5. Should any additional project be established by the District for which the District wishes the Construction Manager provide services, the District shall establish the scope of such project, the cost of the work, and assignment of the Construction Manager and, if the Construction Manager accepts that assignment, the services for that project will be provided in accordance with terms of the 2008 Agreement.

6. It is hereby agreed, the rights and responsibilities of the District and the Construction Manager with regard to the Additional Projects in paragraph 1 above, and any additional projects approved and set forth in paragraph 5 above shall, unless otherwise agreed to by the parties, be in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the 2008 Agreement, which Agreement is hereby incorporated into this Agreement by reference.

7. The District shall provide office space and telephone/internet service for use by the Construction Manager. The District shall require contractor's to name Construction Manager as an additional insured on the contractor's liability insurance policies.

8. Except as specifically set forth herein, the 2008 Agreement between the Construction Manager and the District shall remain in full force and effect.

HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into this **31st day of October, 2011** by and between the Board of Education of the **WEST ISLIP UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT** (hereinafter "**WEST ISLIP**"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at **100 Sherman Avenue, West Islip NY 11795** and the Board of Education of the **MIDDLE COUNTRY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT** (hereinafter "**MIDDLE COUNTRY**"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at **8 43rd Street, Centereach, New York**.

W I T N E S S E T H

WHEREAS, **WEST ISLIP** is authorized pursuant to Section 912 of the Education Law, to enter into a contract with **MIDDLE COUNTRY** for the purpose of having **MIDDLE COUNTRY** provide health and welfare services to children residing in **WEST ISLIP** and attending a non-public school located in **MIDDLE COUNTRY**,

WHEREAS, certain students who are residents of **WEST ISLIP** are attending non-public schools located in **MIDDLE COUNTRY**,

WHEREAS, **MIDDLE COUNTRY** has received a request(s) from said non-public schools for the provision of health and welfare services to the aforementioned students,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereby mutually agree as follows.

1. The term of this Agreement shall be from **July 1, 2011** through **June 30, 2012** inclusive.
2. **MIDDLE COUNTRY** warrants that the health and welfare services will be provided by licensed health care providers. **MIDDLE COUNTRY** further represents that such services shall be performed by health care providers that are licensed under the laws of the State of New York, including New York State Department of Health and the State Education Department licensing requirements, if applicable. **MIDDLE COUNTRY** further represents that such services will be in accordance with all applicable provisions of Federal, State, and local laws, rules, and regulations, including Section 912 of the Education Law, and the student's IEP, if applicable. **MIDDLE COUNTRY** shall certify that all service providers possess documentation evidencing such license qualifications as required by Federal, State, and local laws, rules, regulations and orders.
3. **MIDDLE COUNTRY** understands and agrees that it will comply and is responsible for complying with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, rules and regulations with respect to the services provided pursuant to this Agreement.

4. The services provided by MIDDLE COUNTRY shall be consistent with the services available to students attending public schools within the MIDDLE COUNTRY School District; and may include, but are not limited to:
 - a. all services performed by a physician, physician assistant, dentist, dental hygienist, registered professional nurse, nurse practitioner, school psychologist, school social worker, or school speech therapist,
 - b. dental prophylaxis,
 - c. vision and hearing screening examinations,
 - d. the taking of medical histories and the administration of health screening tests,
 - e. the maintenance of cumulative health records, and
 - f. the administration of emergency care programs for ill or injured students.

It is expressly understood and agreed between the parties that the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not include any teaching services.

5. In exchange for the provision of health and welfare services pursuant to this Agreement, **WEST ISLIP** agrees to pay MIDDLE COUNTRY the sum of **\$709.54** per eligible pupil for the 2011–2012 school year.
6. **WEST ISLIP** shall pay MIDDLE COUNTRY within thirty (30) days of **WEST ISLIP'S** receipt of a detailed written invoice from MIDDLE COUNTRY. Said invoice shall specify the services provided, dates that the invoice covers, and the total amount due for the period specified.
7. If, during the term of this Agreement, a student becomes eligible to receive services pursuant to this Agreement, MIDDLE COUNTRY shall undertake to provide services pursuant to this Agreement, and the amount of compensation owed by **WEST ISLIP** shall be prorated accordingly to accurately reflect the period of time services were provided to the student.
8. If, during the term of this Agreement, a student ceases to be eligible to receive services pursuant to this Agreement, MIDDLE COUNTRY shall no longer be responsible for providing services to that student pursuant to this Agreement, and the amount of compensation owed by **WEST ISLIP** shall be prorated accordingly to accurately reflect the period of time services were provided to the student.
9. MIDDLE COUNTRY shall furnish any supplies or equipment necessary to provide the services pursuant to this Agreement to the extent such items are not provided by the non-public school.
10. Both parties agree to provide the State access to all relevant records which the State requires to determine either MIDDLE COUNTRY'S or **WEST ISLIP'S** compliance with applicable Federal, State, or local laws, rules, or regulations with respect to provision of services pursuant to this Agreement. Both parties agree to retain all materials and records relevant to the execution or performance of their obligations pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with the record retention requirements for such materials and records.

11. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and or come into contact with protected health information as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.
12. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services performed pursuant to this Agreement is deemed confidential information. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. Both parties further agree that any information received by either party's employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of the parties, their employees, agents, and/or students will be treated as confidential and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, organizations, or third parties. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule, or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
13. Services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided without regard to race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, age, disability, or sponsorship.
14. All notices which are required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, addressed as follows:

15. It is expressly understood that this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred without prior written consent of the other party.
16. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce every provision of this Agreement.

17. Should any provision of this Agreement, for any reason, be declared invalid and/or unenforceable, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provision(s) eliminated.
18. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws and regulations of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations.
19. This Agreement is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supercedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.
20. This Agreement may not be changed orally, but only by an Agreement, in writing, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
21. It is mutually agreed that this contract shall not become valid and binding upon either party until the contract is approved by the Superintendent of Schools of **WEST ISLIP**.

And the party of the second part hereby agrees with the party of the first part that the services to be provided shall consist of the following:





THIS AGREEMENT is made this 10th day of January, 2012, by and between the BOARD OF EDUCATION, UNIONDALE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT (hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES"), as the party of the first part, having its principal place of business at 933 GOODRICH STREET, UNIONDALE, NY 11553-2499, and the BOARD OF EDUCATION, WEST ISLIP S.D. ("hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES") as the party of the second part, having its principal place of business at 100 SHERMAN AVENUE WEST ISLIP, NY 11795.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the School Districts who are the parties to this Agreement are duly empowered by Section 912 of the Education Law to enter into a contract for the purpose of providing and/or receiving health and welfare services;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

1. **DEFINITIONS:** For the purposes of this Agreement,
 - a. "SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES" shall mean the School District in which the nonpublic school which has requested health and welfare services is located.
 - b. "SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES" shall mean the School District that is contracting for health and welfare services for its resident students who attend a nonpublic school located within the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES.

2. This Agreement shall take effect on the 1ST day of September, 2011, for the period of September 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012, and terminate on June 30, 2012, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms set forth herein.

3. If requested by a nonpublic school located within the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES, such School District shall provide health and welfare services to the pupils who attend such non-public school equivalent to the health and welfare services that it provides to the public school pupils enrolled in the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES. Such services shall consist of, but not limited to the following:

- a. Nurse Services
- b. Physician/Dental Services
- c. School Speech Correction Services*
- d. School Psychological Services*
- e. School Social Work Services
- f. Examinations for Participants in Athletics
- g. Notification of Parents Regarding Defect and Follow-Up
- h. Visions and Hearing Tests
- i. First Aid Supplies and Health Record Forms
- j. Provision of Medical Equipment such as Audiometers and Mechanical Vision Testers Required by School Nurse/Physician

The services set forth above may be rendered on nonpublic school premises except for school psychological and speech correction services as further described below.

* School psychological and speech correction services may be rendered on nonpublic school premises only to the extent that such services are *diagnostic* in nature. To the extent that such services are therapeutic or remedial in nature, they may be rendered to a student attending a nonpublic school *only on a religiously neutral site*. A religiously neutral site may be, but is not limited to, a public school, a mobile unit or some other public location.

In addition to the requested services described above, the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall provide the following health and welfare services *without the requirement that the non-public school request such services*: (1) immunization mandates set forth in Sections 2164 and 2165 of the New York State Public Health Law and 10 NYCRR Sections 66-1 and 66-2; and (2) vision screening services to all new admissions within six (6) months of enrollment pursuant to Section 905(4) of the Education Law.

The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall make its personnel available to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES for participation in District Child Study, 504 Team and Committee on Special Education meetings, as appropriate. The SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES shall notify the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES of the need for its presence at these meetings within reasonable time prior to the date of the meeting. Copies of all reports, testing and observation reports prepared in connection with this Agreement shall be furnished to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES upon request.

It is expressly understood and agreed between the parties that (1) the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES may not provide such services to pupils attending nonpublic schools that are not available to the public school students enrolled in the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES; and (2) *the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not include any teaching service.*

4. The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES warrants that such health care services (1) will be provided by licensed health and welfare providers; (2) shall be performed by health care providers that are licensed under the laws of the State of New York, inclusive of New York State Department of Health and State Education Department Licensing requirements, if applicable; and (3) will be in accord with all pertinent provisions of Federal, State, and local statutes, rules, and regulations, including, Section 912 of the Education Law, and the student's Individualized Education Plan ("IEP"), if applicable. The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall certify that all health care providers possess documentation evidencing such license qualifications as required by Federal, State, or local statutes, rules, regulations and orders.

5. The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES understands and agrees that it will comply and is responsible for complying with all applicable Federal, State, and local statutes, rules and ordinances, with respect to the services herein described.

6. In full consideration for the services to be rendered by the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES for the period of this Agreement, upon presentation of an invoice by the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES evidencing the allocation of such costs in accordance with the terms set forth herein, the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES will pay the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES at the rate of \$614.29 per student for the period of September 2011 through June 2012.

7. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall immediately notify the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES if a student is no longer receiving the services described herein. Upon such notification, payment for students removed shall be pro-rated for the period of time services were provided to the student.

8. The SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES shall obtain whatever releases or other legal documents that are necessary in order that the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES may render full and complete performance of

the obligations set forth in this Agreement. It is understood and agreed by the parties to this Agreement that the full responsibility for obtaining such clearances rests on the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES.

9. Both parties to this Agreement agree to provide the State access to all relevant records which the State requires to determine either the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES'S or the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES'S compliance with applicable Federal or State statutes or regulations with the effect of law, which regulate either the execution of the Agreement or the performance of obligations under the Agreement. Both parties further agree to retain all materials and records relevant to the execution or performance of the Agreement in accordance with the record retention requirements for such materials and records.

10. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and or come into contact with *protected health information* as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA"). The Parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.

11. Both parties to this Agreement, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services provided for in this Agreement is deemed confidential information and they shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. It is further agreed that any information received by the parties, their employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement, which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of their employees, agents, clients and/or students will be treated by the parties, their employees and agents in full confidence and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms or organizations. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA").

12. This Agreement may be terminated by either party to the other party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party in accordance with the Education Law. In the event of such termination, the parties will adjust the accounts due and the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES will undertake no additional expenditures not already provided. Upon any such termination, the parties shall endeavor in an orderly manner to wind down activities hereunder. In the event of termination, all reports and services due to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING

SERVICES must be completed by the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES, its employees, and/or agents within thirty (30) days of the termination date.

13. Services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided without regard to race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, age, disability or sponsorship.

14. All notices required or permitted shall be made in writing by hand delivery, be deemed given on the date of delivery or upon receipt. Notice shall be delivered or mailed to:

15. The parties shall not assign, transfer, or convey any of its respective rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the non-assigning party.

16. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York. If any portion of this Agreement is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

17. This Agreement constitutes the full and complete Agreement between the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES and the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES and supersedes all prior written and oral agreements, commitments or understandings with respect thereto. This Agreement may not be altered, changed, added to, deleted from, or modified except through the mutual written consent of the parties.

18. The undersigned representative of the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES hereby represents and warrants that the undersigned is an officer, director, or agent of the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES with full legal rights, power, and authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES and bind the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES with respect to the obligations enforceable against the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES in accordance with terms.

19. The undersigned representative of the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES hereby represents and warrants that the undersigned is an officer, director, or agent of the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES with full legal rights, power, and authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES and bind the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES with respect to the obligations enforceable against the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES in accordance with terms.

20. This Agreement is subject to approval by the Board of Education, by resolution duly approved.

SEDCAR AGREEMENT 2011-2012

BY AND BETWEEN the West Islip School District, with offices at 100 Sherman Avenue, New York, 11795, hereinafter referred to as "the District" and _____ hereinafter referred to as the "Provider";

WHEREAS, The District is the Local Education Agency (LEA) for the purposes of receiving federal IDEA flow-through funds from the New York State Education Department for Part B, Section 611 (P.L. 94-142 for students with disabilities ages 3-21) and Section 619 (P.L. 99-457 for students with disabilities ages 3-5) and suballocating such funds to approved special education programs (ASEPs) for certain students with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Provider is an eligible approved special education program authorized to provide special education services to preschool and/or school-aged special education students; and

WHEREAS, the District is authorized to contract with the Provider to provide special education program for preschool and/or school-aged students with educational disabilities who reside within the District and who are placed in such program for the provision of special education services.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

1. The term of this Agreement shall be for the school year beginning between **July 1, 2011 - June 30, 2012**. Payment of the sub-allocation of such funds to the Provider shall be made on a per student basis.
2. In order to receive payment for the services rendered under this Agreement, the Provider must complete all required forms. The Provider shall complete the SEDCAR-1 Form. A fully completed copy will be made a part of this Agreement as Attachment A. The Provider will receive payment from the District based on the total number of students as indicated on the SEDCAR-1 and subject to verification.
3. The SEDCAR-1 Form must be completed and received by the District no later than November 29, 2010. The FS 25 and an invoice with the total amount due must be received by the District no later than June 1, 2012. The FS 10F shall be completed by the Provider and submitted to the District no later than sixty (60) days after the close of the Provider's grant year. Upon receipt of the required forms, the District shall process payment of funds to the Provider

All forms and notices that shall be given to the District shall be sent to the Board at the following address:
100 Sherman Avenue, West Islip, NY 11795

4. The District shall process payments to the Provider in accordance with applicable laws. The Board is only obligated to process payments to the Provider for the

provision of services in the approved program as permitted under IDEA. Payments made to the Provider pursuant to this Agreement shall be utilized only for the purpose as provided in IDEA.

5. The Provider shall maintain their books, records and accounts pertaining to the use of these funds in accordance with the requirements of the Reimbursable Cost Manual. The District, SED and the State Comptroller, or their authorized representative(s) shall have the right to conduct a fiscal audit of the Project supported by these funds, provided, however, that nothing in this Agreement will diminish or modify the audit procedures required in any other contract which the Provider may have with the District for the provision of special education or other services. Access to property and personnel related to the Provider's use of these funds shall be provided during an audit.
6. If, upon audit of this Agreement, the District determines that funds were used for unapproved uses, said funds shall be returned to the District upon request.
7. Except as otherwise directed by the District, the Provider shall, until six (6) years after the end of the term of the Agreement, or until six (6) years after the termination of the Agreement, retain all books and records required hereunder, including, without limitation, all cost and accounting records, employee certifications, staff (pedagogical and non-pedagogical) attendance, service and time records pertaining to the use of these funds. The Provider shall make all books and records available to the District, the SED, the State Comptroller, or their authorized representatives, for review and audit at such times during business hours as they may request.
8. The Provider shall furnish any additional data and reports, including, but not limited to SED submissions, as the District deems to be related to the performance of the Agreement, upon request of the District. The Provider shall be given a reasonable time to respond to such requests.
9. The Provider shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws in connection with the services to be provided by the Provider under this Agreement.
10. The District and the Provider may agree that if state law or regulation is amended during the term of this Agreement to provide for the flow-through to the Provider of funds from prior years known as "carryover funds", this Agreement may also pertain to the distribution of those funds in accordance with the requirements of the law or regulation.
11. The District reserves the right to amend this Agreement, as may be necessary, in order to comply with any change in applicable law, regulations and guidelines governing the operation of this Agreement.
12. This Agreement may only be modified or amended by mutual agreement of the parties, in writing.

13. The parties to this Agreement will maintain their independent and separate identities, each having exclusive control of its own management, assets and affairs. Neither party will, by virtue of this Agreement, assume any liability or obligation of the other party.

14. The Provider agrees to indemnify and save harmless the District, its officers, employees and agents, against any and all claims, liabilities, loss, damages, suit, proceeding, costs or expenses whatsoever, including those for personal injuries and property damage, as they may relate, in any manner, to the services provided by the Agency to the District pursuant to this Agreement. Said indemnification, defense and hold harmless shall apply to any claim, liability, loss, damages, suit, proceeding, costs or expenses in which the District, its officers, employees and agents may be named as a party (except for negligent acts and omissions of the District), notwithstanding that the Agency may deem said claim, liability, loss, damages, suit, proceeding, costs or expenses frivolous or without merit. It is intended that this provision be interpreted in the broadest manner possible so as to insulate the District from any liability or judgment, monetary or otherwise, as the same may relate to the personnel and services provided by the Agency the District pursuant to this Agreement (but not for the negligent acts or omissions of the District, its officers, employees and agents).

15. The Provider agrees that it will not discriminate with respect to the provision of special education services on the grounds of race, religion creed, color, national origin, sex, age, disability or other non-merit factors, nor discriminate against any individual on such ground.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Whereas the West Islip Union Free School District ("the District") and the West Islip Secretarial Employees ("WISE") wish to memorialize an agreement setting forth the terms and conditions of the split assignment for Lisa Baynon.

1. The parties to this Agreement hereby agree Article II *Recognition & Dues Deduction* shall be amended to reflect "Claims Auditor" and "Receptionist" are titles for which the District recognizes the Association as the sole and exclusive bargaining representative.

2. Effective July 1, 2010, Lisa Baynon shall be a full-time, twelve (12) month employee devoting sixty (60%) percent of her time to the duties of Claims Auditor and forty (40%) percent of her time to the duties of Receptionist.
